Dr. Kyle Murray Honored with Environmental Stewardship Award

On April 20, 2017, Dr. Kyle E. Murray of the Oklahoma Geological Survey (OGS) was presented a "Recognition for Environmental Stewardship" Award from the University of Oklahoma Environmental Concerns Committee (http://www.ou.edu/admin/ecc/) in appreciation of his efforts in responsible use and protection of the environment through conservation and sustainable practices. The mission of the Environmental Concerns Committee is to "advise the president of the university concerning environmental issues and to promote awareness of energy and other resources conservation, recycling, and personal and environmental well-

being and safety."

Dr. Murray was nominated by fellow colleagues and students who wished to recognize his hard work and dedication to studies in the field of Environmental Sciences.

A certificate and plaque were presented to Dr. Murray during the Responsibility and Sustainability Fair hosted by the Environmental Concerns Committee and Housing & Food Services (Fig. 1; http://cas.ou.edu/ou-ecc-housing-food-services-sustainability-responsibility-fair).

Dr. Murray is the first faculty member presented with this award at the University of Oklahoma, along with

Some of Dr. Murray's recent projects include (1) identifying contaminants of emerging concern (CEC) in Lake Thunderbird; and (2) measuring hydrogeologic properties of the Arbuckle Group and analyzing its relationship to induced seismicity.
